## This Week's Parashah

Moses instructs the Israelites to bring olive oil to light the lamps of the Tabernacle, which will burn from evening until morning. The lamps are to be the responsibility of Aaron and his sons. Moses is told to ordain Aaron and his sons as Kohanim (priests). They are to be adorned in special clothes: linen breeches, tunics, sashes, and turbans. The Kohen Gadol (high priest) is to wear a special robe of pure blue decorated at the hem with pomegranates and golden bells. Over this robe, an apron-like layer (the Ephod) woven of gold, blue, purple, and crimson yarns, is to be worn. Connected to the Ephod is "the breastplate of judgment" (choshen) decorated on the front with four rows of precious stones. He is also to wear a gold plate engraved "Holy to the Lord" to be tied with a blue cord to the front of his turban. The Kohanim are to be ordained in a special ceremony which involved washing, dressing, and anointing them with oil, followed by the offering of various sacrifices.

The Maftir reading for Shabbat Zachor tells us to remember the Amalakites who attacked the Israelites from behind, killing the stragglers: the old, the infirm, the very young and the women.

## Today's Haftarah

In the Haftarah, Saul, recently crowned King of Israel, spared the life of the Amalekite king after defeating the Amalakites in battle. When Saul merely takes him prisoner, Samuel chastises him for not adhering to God's word, which is to eradicate the Amalakites entirely. This week's Haftarah connects to the calendar rather than the weekly Torah portion. According to tradition, Haman, who plotted to kill the Jews of Persia in the Megillah of Esther, is considered to be a descendant of the Amalekite kings spared by Saul. This is why we read these portions just before Purim.
