This Week's Parashah

In today's Torah reading, God is hesi-
tant to go with the children of Israel
into the promised land because they
are a stiff-necked people. Moses
speaks with God directly and con-
vinces God to forgive the sins of the
people and accompany them on their
journey. A new set of the ten com-
mandments are made, as God passes
before Moses in very anthropo-
morphic terms, covering Moshe's
eyes with God's hand, so that Moses
doesn't see God's face. God makes a
covenant with the children of Israel,
outlining rules against idolatry and
intermarriage, and instructions for
observing Pesach, offering sacrifices,
observing Shavuot, observing pil-
grimage festivals and finally the com-
mandment not to boil a kid in its
mother's milk.

Today's Haftarah

The scene of a valley full of dry bones,
resurrected before the mental eyes of
the prophet Ezekiel, is one of the most
enigmatic apparitions experienced by
this prophet, who is famous for his
other unusual visions. The vision begins
when God sets Ezekiel down in a valley
full of bones and asks Ezekiel if they
can be brought back to life, to which
Ezekiel responds that only God knows
that. God then tells Ezekiel to speak
this prophecy over the bones and
Ezekiel does as he is told. The bones
begin to come together and to grow
flesh. But they were still not alive. God
then tells Ezekiel to offer another
prophecy, this time to the "breath" or
"wind". The wind comes and the corps-
es breath and come to life again in
great numbers. God then explains the
vision.
