## This Week's Parashah

God commands Moses to take a census of all the  
Israelite males over twenty years of age. Moses,  
Aaron, and the heads of each tribe record the  
census, the total of which is 603,500. The Levites  
are counted in a separate census, since they are  
not eligible to go to war. Moses instructs them to  
camp around the Tabernacle. They serve as a bar-  
rier between the Tabernacle and the remaining  
tribes, who are instructed to camp in four groups  
of three tribes each also around the Tabernacle.  
Originally, firstborn Israelites were consecrated to  
God, since they escaped the plague of the death  
of all firstborn in Egypt. Now, however, God tells  
Moses to appoint the Levites to serve in the sanc-  
tuary in place of the firstborn. Twenty-two thou-  
sand male Levites are the substitute for 22,000  
firstborn Israelites who would otherwise have  
been required to carry out the sacrifices and reli-  
gious worship in the Tabernacle. For the remain-  
ing 273 firstborn Israelites - for whom there were  
not enough Levites to serve as substitutes - a  
redemption price of five shekels per head is col-  
lected and paid to Aaron and his sons. A separate  
census is taken of the Kohanite clan of the Levites  
that is given the task of carrying the sacred ob-  
jects from the Tabernacle during the Israelites'  
journeys.

## Today's Haftarah

Today's haftarah is part of a long nar-  
rative in the Bible describing David's  
ultimate ascent to the throne. King  
Saul was envious of David's fame in  
battle and urged his courtiers to kill his  
perceived rival. Ultimately, Saul himself  
pursues David. David flees to his close  
friend Jonathan, Saul's own son. David  
and Jonathan set forth a plan to reveal  
Saul's true intentions for David. The  
events in this week's haftarah begin on  
the eve of the new moon (Rosh Cho-  
desh). This haftarah is always chanted  
when Rosh Chodesh falls on a Sunday.  
The Shabbat immediately preceding  
Rosh Chodesh is called Machar Cho-  
desh, signifying that Rosh Chodesh  
begins the next day.
