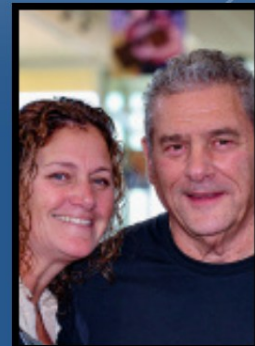

EVERYTHING YOU WANT TO KNOW ABOUT THE HIGH HOLIDAYS AT CBS THIS YEAR!

Q: Which Clergy will be conducting services?

A: Rabbi Chapman, Cantor Stoeher, and Rabbi Honig will all be participating in our various services at Congregation Beth Shalom throughout the High Holidays, so whichever service you attend you will participate with our clergy.



Q: When will Yizkor take place?

A: On Yom Kippur Day, **Monday, September 21**, Yizkor will take place during the Torah service, **but not before 11:00 a.m.**

Our Yizkor Memorial Tribute will be streaming in our lobby and available on our [High Holiday website](#). Submissions for the **CBS Yizkor Memorial Book** and **Memorial Tributes** are due no later than **Friday, August 21**.

Q: Are tickets required for all High Holiday services?

A: Tickets are required for all of our services during the High Holidays at both Congregation Beth Shalom and the Northbrook Community Center (formerly Northbrook Leisure Center). All CBS members in good standing will receive tickets for the High Holidays.

Q: We will be attending Ark Adventures on Rosh Hashanah as a family, our 3rd grader will be attending Camp Shofar, and my spouse is planning on going to most of the services in the Kamensky Sanctuary throughout the holidays. What do we need to do?

A: Please complete the Families With Young Children & Youth [Ticket Registration Form](#) as soon as possible to let us know who is coming to Ark Adventures and Camp Shofar. You will get a special ticket for those services/programs. All adult members in good standing will receive tickets for services in the sanctuary.

Q: Will the High Holiday services be live streamed? Will they be restricted for CBS members only?

A: Yes, all of our High Holiday services that take place from the Kamensky Sanctuary will be [live streamed](#) as well as our Mincha/Ma'ariv services from the Feather Beit Midrash. High Holiday services are a benefit of your CBS membership. Therefore we will email you a **password** for the live streaming approximately **one week** before Rosh Hashanah.

Q: I have a disabled license plate/placard. Will there be reserved parking for me?

A: We will have a limited number of accessible spaces. We recommend arriving when the lot opens for an easier time navigating your way into the building. The lot will open **30 minutes** before the start time of services. We will have parking attendants onsite to assist you in finding parking. If you have difficulty walking long distances, you may prefer to be dropped off near the front door before securing a parking spot for themselves.

Parking during the holidays is always a challenge. We ask that you carpool, walk, or drive only one car to the synagogue. Northbrook allows street parking in the neighborhoods; please be kind, do not block driveways.

Q: Are children allowed in the Kamensky Sanctuary service?

A: Children of all ages are welcome in any service with an adult.

We ask that strollers be parked in the designated area for safety reasons.

There will be a Family Quiet Room available throughout the High Holidays at CBS for parents or family members to bring children age 5 and under if they need to step out of services.

Q: My adult children are visiting for the holidays this year. Can I buy guest tickets so they can attend services with me?

A: Yes! Guest tickets are available for purchase for **\$360** per guest (\$200 for Rosh Hashanah or Yom Kippur only). Submit the [Online Guest Ticket Form](#) or complete the form on **page 7**.

If your adult children are members of another synagogue, they qualify for **reciprocity** tickets. Please contact Mara Bernstein at MBernstein@BethShalomNB.org or 847.498.4100 x 110 by **Monday, August 31** to arrange for reciprocity.

As we prepare for the High Holidays,
we ask each congregant to drop off food

Engaging with our Inner Prayers on Yom Kippur

Every year Jews gather to wrestle with our inner selves and to consider how we might approach the New Year. One wishing to connect with God on this auspicious day offers words of our tradition but can also offer words of one's own conscience and heart.

When people travel to Israel it is common for them to visit the Kotel, the Western Wall, and it is quite normal that they place a *kvitel*, a small piece of paper on which one pens a petitionary prayer, in a crevice of the Kotel as a "note to God". We wish to invite **every member of CBS** to do likewise for the High Holidays.

This personal act of "letter writing to God" is an added gesture of petition which enhances one's opportunity to reach out to God in a new way. Please complete your personal note online by **Friday, September 18**, which we will then place in the Ark. These notes shall remain in the Ark until after the holiday of Sukkot, when one's complete judgment by God is said to be finalized.
