This Week's Parashah

This morning we read the Song of Moses. The poem reviews the history of the Children of Israel while praising God and describing the special care God has given them. Lacking the proper appreciation for God's goodness, the people had turned from God to the worship of foreign deities. Because of Israel's unfaithfulness, they will suffer God's wrath. Ultimately, however, God will show mercy to the Israelites and deliver them from their enemies. Moses tells the people to take the warning he has recited very seriously. Israel's observance of God's laws is not a trifling matter. These laws are the essence of their lives. The portion closes with God directing Moses to ascend Mt. Nebo and to look at the Land promised to the Israelites. Moses will not be allowed to enter the Land of Israel because of the episode in which he struck the rock when God commanded him to speak to it. This morning's Torah portion marks the second time that Moses has utilized a poetic structure to communicate with the Israelites. The first time was after Israel's rescue at the Red Sea (Exodus Chap. 15) at the start of the years of wandering in the desert.

Today's Haftarah

The Haftarah today is from the Book of Samuel. Like Moses' farewell song in the Torah reading, this is a song of thanksgiving by David. He expresses gratitude to God for having delivered him from his enemies. When David was in great danger he prayed to God and his prayer was answered, for God is powerful and rules the world, deciding the destinies of humanity. It is God who anointed David and his descendants after him.
