School Report

The Religious School is off to a strong start despite a nationwide staffing shortage. Our 3rd through 5th graders are once again amazing us as they progress through the Hebrew levels in our Aleph Champ program. We had a successful Family Tashlich Program on Sunday, October 2nd. The morning included:

- writing our bad deeds on water dissolving paper and watching them disappear
- bubble tashlich
- a *zimriyah* (song festival)
- using a parachute to throw our bad deeds away
- a line dance to the tune of the "Hockey Pokey" which taught us the steps of teshuvah
- playing corn hole where we apologized as we missed the mark
- a game of apologizing and forgiving on a family, community and a global level

During sukkot our students decorated the sukkah and had the opportunity to shake the lulav and etrog as well as enjoy a snack in the sukkah. Our holiday celebrations culminated with a Family Simchat Torah program right before the CBS Erev Simchat Torah Service. Families were able to look at an unrolled unkosher Torah, make flags and make edible Torahs to march with during the service.

Towards the end of the month our 7th grade will begin their Holocaust Studies Unit with Mark Gelfeld. Parents are invited to all 4 sessions and we will then take a fieldtrip to the Illinois Holocaust Museum before Thanksgiving.
