This Week's Parashah

This morning we read the Song of Moses. The song reviews the history of the Children of Israel while praising God and describing the special care God has given them. Lacking the proper appreciation for God's goodness, the people had turned from God to the worship of foreign deities. Because of Israel's unfaithfulness, they will suffer God's wrath. Ultimately, however, God will show mercy to the Israelites and deliver them from their enemies. Moses tells the people to take the warning he has recited very seriously. Israel's observance of God's laws is not a trifling matter. These laws are the essence of their lives. The portion closes with God directing Moses to ascend Mt. Nebo and to look at the Land promised to the Israelites. Moses will not be allowed to enter the Land of Israel because of the episode in which he struck the rock that God had commanded him to speak to. This morning's Torah portion marks the second time that Moses has utilized a poetic structure to communicate with the Israelites. The first time was after Israel's rescue at the Red Sea (Exodus chapter 15) at the start of the years of wandering in the desert.

Today's Haftarah

The Haftarah recited on the Shabbat between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur – Shabbat Shuvah – is taken from three prophets: Hosea, Micah, and Joel. It begins with Hosea's call for Israel to **return** (*shuv*) to God (hence the name given to the Sabbath). The three verses from Micah assure us of God's readiness to forgive our sins. Finally, the selection from Joel pictures the fullness of God's forgiving grace. The three prophets may have been contemporaries (eighth century B.C.E.). In any case, they speak to the same spiritual condition of Israel: the people are in danger of destruction because they have forsaken God. But repentance (*t'shuvah*) will move Him to grant forgiveness to His people. This Haftarah sets an appropriate mood for the Shabbat between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. These days are meant to encourage us to "Return, O Israel, to the Lord your God, for you have stumbled." We can change and return to the correct path. The days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur provide a time to contemplate and take to heart the words of these three prophets of repentance.
