Shalom Chaverim,

While the month of November/Cheshvan/Kislev is often associated with dreary weather in Chicago, there are plenty of fun, entertaining, and educational events going on at CBS to brighten up our days. From the Sisterhood Holiday Boutique to Ark Adventures, from our Hazak Veterans Day Program to Israel in Depth and our always popular Men's Club sponsored Erev Thanksgiving program there are many engaging events coming up for our entire multi-generational community (check out our [calendar](#) for details).

I am writing this article prior to Chris' and my travel to Morocco in early October. I will share that experience with you in a future bulletin message. Of course, by the time you are reading this we will have safely returned, but many of our friends and family wondered if it was safe to travel to Morocco because of the earthquake that devastated the northern region. I responded that in fact our plan was to visit Marrakesh which was close to the epicenter. I have shared with you my stories of travel to Israel after the Yom Kippur war on Kol Nidre and last year my travel to Tiraspol, Moldova. What is lesser known about us is that Chris joined the Peace Corps at around the same time I was in Israel and worked in the Philippines for two years amid civil unrest during the Marcos regime. Perhaps it is no wonder that this Jewish boy from suburban St. Paul and this Catholic/Italian raised girl from Baltimore and Wilmington, Delaware, despite such different cultural backgrounds felt like such kindred spirits the moment we met.

Our travel and our support of our children's travel (sometimes to my distress because of their adventurousness) has always emphasized that we try to quickly immerse ourselves into the life experience of the countries we visit to begin to understand a perspective and view of the world through a different lens. Over the past few years, we have been fortunate to visit several countries: Mexico, Greece, England, Egypt, Morocco, and even Alaska which felt like a different country. The world is so much more culturally diverse than Northbrook, Illinois. The expanded Chicagoland community is truly a cultural melting pot that offers so many opportunities for us to learn about life from different experiences of others.

On the surface, many would not consider a suburban Jewish community like Congregation Beth Shalom as particularly diverse certainly when compared to Chicago and beyond. However, the past two years as your President have given me the opportunity to get know so many of you and I can tell you for all our similarities as Jews, we as a community also offer the richness that diversity provides us if we embrace it. We have different political beliefs towards our own government leadership. We all love and support Israel and its people, but our community also has different opinions towards the Israeli government based on some of its current social policies. We represent many generations of Jewish people spanning 100 years who have come to us from many countries and certainly all regions of the United States. We represent a broad range of religious practice and beliefs. We honor, respect, and support all members of our community regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity. We welcome families in which one of the spouses is not Jewish. And we welcome families who have a member who need more creative ways to engage with us socially and religiously. One new family, the Abdalsalam's from Syria, who joined our extended community through the HIAS refugee program this past summer is lovely. I know that those volunteers who have started working with the family have felt enriched by their developing relationships with them.

Unfortunately, too often in our society diversity is shunned rather than embraced. By welcoming our differences and getting to know each other we create opportunities for growth both personally and as a community. Resist that temptation to tune out, but instead reach out. We learn through our life experiences as well as through getting to know people with whom we may think we have little in common. Our diversity at CBS is our strength (not a limitation), and therefore it should be celebrated.

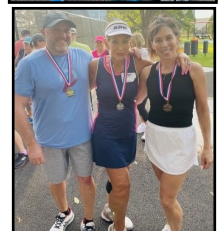

What a wonderful month it has been! The High Holidays provide us with such a perfect opportunity for coming together and celebrating, as well as learning and reflecting. For sisterhood, we are ramping up our programming year, our leaders working hard on engaging programs and initiatives, and we're thinking about ways to reach new and returning members in meaningful ways.

My seven year old daughter and I recently read a PJ Library book together that I found to be such a perfect metaphor for CBS Sisterhood. "The Mysterious Guests: A Sukkot Story" by Eric Kimmel tells the story of brothers Eben and Ezra. Eben was very rich, but selfish and miserly. Every year, he built a magnificent sukkah, beautifully decorated with the finest woods and fruits. Each meal served in his sukkah was like a royal banquet. However, when guests approached his sukkah, he would permit them to come in, but he never allowed them to feel welcomed- never offered them a place around the table or gave them food or drink. He allowed them only to look on and admire their host.

His brother Ezra on the other hand, did not have the means for such a grand sukkah. He built a very plain sukkah made with basic wood and decorated only with simple wildflowers. But Ezra welcomed all guests who came his way, and shared not only food, but also joy and friendship with all who entered.

One sukkot eve, Abraham, Issac, and Jacob came down from heaven and asked to be invited into every sukkah in the land. Can you see how this one will end?

The guests were predictably put off by Eben's lack of hospitality and offered this "blessing" as they left: May this sukkah's outside be like its inside. All of a sudden, Eben's beautiful sukkah disintegrated, a coldness subsuming the structure. When the guests left Ezra's sukkah, after a wonderful meal and kind company, they shared the same blessing: May this sukkah's outside be like its inside. After this, Ezra's sukkah became more beautiful, the walls suddenly filling with silver and flowers turning to gold.

The message of the seemingly simple children's book is so relevant for our CBS Sisterhood. We work really hard to provide well-crafted communications, innovative programming, and thoughtful synagogue support. And we hope that the hard work and positive intentions that we put into our roles are reflected outward into our community. We always want our "outsides"- the energy we put into making what we do beautiful- match our "insides"- the way that we treat each other. We hope that members of our sisterhood, members of Beth Shalom, and the broader community "feel the love"- the warmth and welcoming spirit that we are trying to bring out in everything we do!

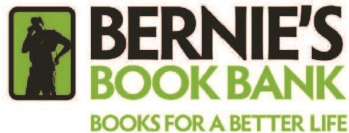

Do not donate books in poor conditions such as: torn or bent covers, torn pages, heavy marking, mildew/mold, off odor, very yellow pages, cracked bindings, hardcover books with cardboard showing at the corners.

SEND-A-KID-TO-ISRAEL-PARTNERSHIP



SKIP is a cooperative program in which families, congregations, and the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Chicago each contribute funds toward an Israel Experience program for participating students. The SKIP goal is for each student to travel to Israel as part of their Jewish education. Enrollment begins during a student's 3rd, 4th, 5th, or 6th grade and continues through 9th grade. Both public school and day school students are eligible. The combined annual contribution for our children at Beth Shalom is \$255 (**\$70 from each family, matched by \$100 from our congregation thanks to the support from the David Zaransky Memorial Skip Fund** and \$85 from Federation). Although the SKIP program may not cover the entire cost of a trip to Israel, the funds make a considerable reduction in the expense. Remember that the funds are in an interest-bearing account. Furthermore, families in financial need can apply for scholarships from other sources.

Enrollment is arranged through our synagogue. After the initial enrollment form is completed, we are responsible for the rest – submitting the partnership agreements, transferring the funds and reporting our children's names to the Federation. Enrollment information will arrive in late October/early November, with a deadline of **November 15th** for the submission of forms and checks.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I register my child?

When you receive the enrollment information, you need to complete the forms and send a \$70 check, made payable to Congregation Beth Shalom, by November 15th.

What if I forget to sign up in 3rd grade? May I start my child at a later date?

Yes, you may begin participating when your child is in 3rd, 4th, 5th, or 6th grade.

If I want to enroll my child who is currently in 4th grade, may I pay past 9th grade and make up a missing year?

You may begin contributions in grades 3, 4, 5, or 6 but you may only contribute through 9th grade.
