RABBI CHAPMAN'S CHRONICLES

Rabbi Chapman



At the height of the Civil Rights Movement, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. made a call to Northern religious leaders, inviting them to join his efforts to secure justice for African Americans. On March 21, 1965, Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, then a professor at JTS, heeded the call, arriving in Selma, Alabama, to march for voter access. It was after this march that Heschel famously commented that he felt his "legs were praying."

Other rabbis and Jewish leaders also participated in the Selma march and other aspects of the Civil Rights Movement. A more local figure, Rabbi William Frankel, a Holocaust survivor, came to Selma from Wilmette, where he was then the rabbi of Beth Hillel. Upon his return he sounded a note of caution: "How will we [in Illinois] react when the battleground will not be in distant Alabama but in our own backyard, even in the suburbs

of Chicago?" In other words, racism, bigotry, and hatred are not only found south of the Mason-Dixon Line. Our own communities also suffer from far too much injustice and division.

In March, a group of Beth Shalom members traveled together on a Civil Rights Journey to see some of these sites firsthand. We do take Rabbi Frankel's words to heart: We did not need to travel 700 miles south to find examples of the effects of slavery and segregation. Chicago was not immune then, nor is it immune now. And yet, there is no substitute for standing on the hallowed ground where some of the fiercest battles for justice were fought: the infamous Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma; the Montgomery intersection where Rosa Parks boarded a city bus; the scarred façade of the

16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, where four little girls were killed in a KKK bombing. There is also no substitute for the memorials, museums, and first-hand accounts we experienced, which exist only in the south.

That being said, our travels were fruitless if they do not translate into activism and change here at home. How can we at Beth Shalom also "pray with our feet"? One idea: Join us at the Buffalo Grove Pride Parade on Sunday, June 2! If you have other ideas, let's work on them together!

Even if they're a crowd of sorrows, who violently sweep your house empty of its furniture, still, treat each guest honorably.

He may be clearing you out for some new delight.

The dark thought, the shame, the malice, meet them at the door laughing, and invite them in.

Be grateful for whoever comes, because each has been sent as a guide from beyond.

There are many emotions we welcome as guests into our home, while others are not as comfortably welcomed. We learn over our lifetimes that we cannot control or choose which guests come to visit. The best we can do sometimes is endure these visits and trust that as guests their visits are temporary. I liken my less pleasant visitors to my experiences of playing in the ocean. When I see a giant wave that is about to slam against me, I relax my body rather than try to dig in and endure a force that I know is much greater than me. By relaxing my body, I am better able to accept the inevitable which allows the force of the wave to pass through me. Many of my current guests- sadness, grief, loss, fear, anger, resentment, and anxiety to name a few must be just as welcomed into my home as my other guests- pride, joy, relief, excitement, and love. My hope, of course, is that the former guests are shorter term visitors, but it is from those visitors I learn the most about myself and motivate me to be the best I can be.



CANTOR'S NOTES



'Never Again is Now' has been a well utilized phrase since the attack on Israel on October 7th. These words, reflecting upon the Holocaust, were being used due to the rampant antisemitism which was the propellant of the attack, and that led to the unearthing of latent antisemitism in the US and around the globe. Communities have been anxiously counting the days since hostages had their lives stolen, literally and figuratively.

Our annual Yom HaShoah Commemoration will take place on **Sunday, May 5**^{th,} at 6:30 p.m. at Beth Shalom. If our cries of Never Again are to mean anything, we must

gather and stand up. Being together will allow us to remember the past (and survivors) as well as creating a stance of unity yet continuing to bring attention to the horrid attacks being unleashed on our people today. We must be sure to pay homage to those who lost their lives, literally and figuratively, during the Shoah in Eastern Europe. This year it would be most appropriate to have a full house in attendance.

Last year a beloved member of CBS, David Dragon, passed on at the age of 99, after having survived the camps of Auschwitz- Birkenau. In Auschwitz he was a brick layer and at Birkenau he was tasked with building a crematorium.

On January 20, 1945, David was sent on a Death March from Auschwitz-Birkenau to Dachau. He was liberated by the United States forces in April 1945.

Prior to his passing, David left a Legacy gift to Beth Shalom. He directed his son, Dr. Leon Dragon, to establish a Yom HaShoah musical event annually to remind this, and future generations, about the atrocities which took place, and to pledge, 'Never Again.' (Some of the funds are available for educational purposes in the Religious School as well). I promise that the time we spend together that evening will be special.

Please bring your family, your neighbors and anyone else who is fighting for the rights of Jewish survival.



Harry S. Truman met his responsibilities and never turned his back on the uphill challenges of life. Truman was a Missouri farmer, revered Captain of Battery D, a failed haberdasher, presiding Judge of Missouri's Jackson County, a two term U.S. Senator, and a Vice President of the United States for only 82 days. Then suddenly, on the death of President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Truman was thrust into office to become our 33rd President of the United States.

On the day after Truman took office he stated these words, "Boys, if you ever pray, pray for me now. I don't know if you fellows ever had a load of hay fall on you, but when they told me yesterday what had happened, I felt like the moon, the stars, and all the planets had fallen on me."

Historian, Jim Gibbons*, will present the life of the Missouri farmer, Harry S. Truman, who became our 33rd President of the United States. Determination and persistence were the keys to Truman's success. This includes the gaining of his wife's hand in marriage, the dropping of the Atomic Bomb, the firing of General Douglas McArthur, and the "whistle-stop, give 'em hell speech campaign." When all the press, the pollsters, and even his mother-in-law felt that he had no chance, Truman overcame all odds to achieve the presidency in his own right. Gibbons will show that even though unanimously the politicians, the press, and the pollsters acclaimed Thomas E. Dewy was the sure presidential winner, the voters were wild about Harry!

Judaism is ripe with examples of oral traditions- stories, laws, and rituals being handed down from generation to generation. We come to understand our collective history through stories, often told to us by parents, grandparents, and teachers. During our Passover seders a few weeks ago, the Haggadah says we should see ourselves as if we had been liberated from Egypt (lir'ot et atzmo), reinforcing the fusion of past and present. Learning from past generations is so critical to who we are as a Jewish community and how we live our Judaism every day.

Yet, when I think about my every day- outside of my Jewish community- I do not have many opportunities to interact with older generations. I work with mostly people my own age. Many of my friends are people with whom I went to college or summer camp. My social network is generational homogenous. However, being a part of the CBS Sisterhood community brings together women of all different ages, in various life stages, and of different levels of leadership experience. This multigenerational network has provided all of us a chance to learn and grow from each other in rich meaningful ways.

Back in March, our Programming VP Jenny Schneider, along with Talia Mikhelson and Amy LeVine, organized an amazing event- *Out of This World Hamantaschen Baking*. For this event, we invited the women of CBS Sisterhood to bring friends and family members of all ages to come make hamantaschen together as a community. As a fun twist, we offered all sorts of different filling flavors like passionfruit, cheesecake, and smores.

Seeing the intergenerational presence at this event was incredible! Parents, grandparents, young children, and teens all enjoyed rolling the dough and choosing fillings- from the traditional to the unique! It was a wonderful opportunity to come together as a community of all ages, working together on this time-honored tradition. While it seemed that prune and poppy seed attracted a particularly loyal group of bakers, and the age range for participants who wanted to make funfetti hamantaschen with neon blue frosting and rainbow sprinkles was perhaps limited to the elementary school set, everyone had a great time being together, learning, laughing, and snacking on chocolate chips.

For me, this was a great reminder of the value of intergenerational programs, and how Jewish ritual easily enables these types of experiences. Our holidays, values, and practices have so many ways to find personal meaning and community engagement for Jews of all ages, and CBS Sisterhood is happy to mix the ingredients to enable intergenerational programs- physically and metaphorically!

On Her Own is a fascinating novel by Israeli author Lihi Lapid. Lapid, a columnist and an activist, is the wife of Yair Lapid, the former prime minister of Israel.

The story begins when Nina, a beautiful and smart 18-year-old, wakes up in the stairwell adjacent to a Tel Aviv apartment. Her only possession is the torn mini dress that she is wearing. Nina remembers that she witnessed a murder and jumped out of a car. Nina is involved with Johnny, a married crime boss. Nina is discovered by Carmela, a confused older widow who thinks Nina is her young granddaughter, Dana. Carmela's two sons have left her. One is a fallen IDF soldier. Her other son, Itamar, moved to America "for a year at most," but has been gone for six. Itamar's daughter Dana was Carmela's happy pill. The family rarely visits and Itamar calls weekly and deludes himself into believing his mother is fine. Carmela brings Nina

into her apartment and the situation is a positive one for both women. Nina becomes Carmela's caregiver although Carmela continues to call her Dana and Nina calls Carmela Grandma. Nina lives in fear of being discovered by Johnny or Itamar.

Nina's mother, Irina, is a Russian immigrant who raised Nina alone and worked hard to provide for her. Irina is frantic because she cannot reach Nina and the police offer little help. Complicating matters is that Nina recently ran away from home to be with Johnny and to escape Irina's wrath. Johnny is also looking for Nina and he confronts Irina and steals Irina's phone. As Lapid said in an interview **On Her Own** is a story of "what our kids owe us, or what it means to be a good adult kid". Lapid's writing is captivating, and the novel is filled with relatable situations and thought-provoking themes. Reading and discussing this book about loneliness would be a great way to bring people together.
