
Welcome to Congregation Beth Shalom!

This Week's Parashah

Moses expands upon the earlier
commandment regarding Shabbat,
as found in the Ten Command-
ments. Whoever does any work
shall be put to death, and kindling
fire is considered a violation of
Shabbat. Moses reminds the
Israelites that they should bring
donations for the construction of
the Tabernacle, and he gives
specific instructions about the
materials. Mose's directions
emphasize the role of the heart:
gifts must come from "everyone
whose heart so moves him" and
those who are skilled should be in-
volved in the project. There is a
particular role for women as well-
as spinners and weavers. Moses
showcases the talent of Bezalel
and Oholiab, who are the master
craftsmen of the Tabernacle. The
people bring an overabundance of
gifts to the building of the
Tabernacle, and their gift giving
has to be stopped. (*JPS B'nai Mitz-

Today's Haftarah

This is Shabbat Parah, the Shabbat
on which we recall the use of a Red
Heifer to purify those who had be-
come ritually impure through con-
tact with the dead. The special Maf-
tir Torah portion focuses on becom-
ing ritually fit to offer sacrifices - an
important theme before the Festival
of Passover. The Haftarah picks up
on the idea of cleansing, and pro-
vides a lesson on becoming morally
pure in order to fulfill the teachings
of God. God tells the prophet Ezeke-
iel that when the Children of Israel
will sanctify God's name, they will
be allowed to inhabit the Land of
Israel. God will give them a new
heart and a new spirit, and they will
be blessed with good crops and
protected for the sake of God's
name. With their common theme of
moral purification, the Haftarah and
Maftir portions connect well with
the lengthy and difficult process of
preparing ourselves and our homes
for the upcoming festival of Pesach.
