### Torah reading Day 7

God leads the newly free Israelites from Egypt - by day in a pillar of cloud, and by night as a pillar of fire. Pharaoh regrets letting the Israelites go, and sends an elite chariot force after them. On God's instruction, Moses divides the sea, and the Israelites pass through safely. When the Egyptians follow, the sea closes over them. In gratitude for the redemption, Moses composes the Song of the Sea.

### Torah reading Day 8

In reviewing the observances of the three Pilgrimage Festivals, Moses begins by placing Pesach in "the month of Aviv" (Spring). The Israelites will be required to offer a Paschal sacrifice, to eat *matzah*, and to remember the Exodus from Egypt all the days of their lives. Fifty days later, they will observe Shavuot - the Feast of Weeks. And in the fall, Sukkot will be celebrated. All three festivals were occasions for Israelites to come with offerings to God's Sanctuary.
