This Week's Parashah

This week we start the epilogue to
the Torah. Moses, now 120 years old,
calls upon Joshua to succeed him as
leader. He then transmits the Torah
to the Kohanim (Priests), instructing
the people to gather every seven
years at the festival of Sukkot to
hear the reading of the Torah. Moses
urges the people to continue to
follow God's laws after Moses is
gone. Moses takes a private moment
with Joshua, encouraging him with
his huge task ahead, saying, "Hazak
ve'ematz - Be strong and resolute,"
words that are also at the end of
Psalm 27 that we recite specially this
time of year. He prepares to read
them a poem, which we will hear in
parashat Ha'azinu next week.

Today's Haftarah

Shabbat Shuvah gets its name both
from the time of year (a time of
turning ourselves around and re-
penting) as well as the first word of
the special haftarah this week. The
prophet Hosea calls on the nation
to repent, pleading with God to ac-
cept the words of our mouths in-
stead of animal sacrifices. In Ho-
sea's mind, God accepts our apology
and wipes the slate clean. The
prophet Micah, a younger contem-
porary of Hosea, echoes these
words, reminding us (and God)
about Divine forgiveness, and
bringing the virtue of our ancestors
as an example of how capable we
are to be a loyal people. Hopefully
these words prompt us to forgive
and ask for forgiveness of others.
