This Week's Parashah

Following the episode with the
golden calf, God directs Moses to
carve a new set of tablets, upon
which God will inscribe the words
written on the now shattered
tablets. God recites His divine
attributes, familiar to us as the
prayer: "Ado'nai, Ado'nai, Eil
Rachum v'Chanun..." God then
renews the Covenant with the
Israelites, expressing God's
requirements for the covenant.

Today's Haftarah

The Haftarah is part of the doom
prophecy, against Gog of the land of
Magog. The prophecy predicts the
horrific punishment of Israel's enemies
and the subsequent repurification of the
land. On this special Shabbat of Chol
HaMoed Sukkot, we read a chapter from
the book of Ecclesiastes (Kohelet),
narrated by a nameless person who calls
himself a "Teacher," and identifies
himself as the current king of Israel and a
son of King David. The Teacher opens
with the exclamation, "Vanity of vanities .
. . ! All is vanity" (1:2). He laments that
everything in life is endless and
meaningless - especially human toil and
the cycles of nature - for nothing is ever
truly new on earth. As the wisest man in
Jerusalem, the Teacher feels he is cursed
with the unhappy task of discerning
wisdom, for he has seen "all the deeds
that are done under the sun" (1:14). In a
mixture of prose and verse, the Teacher
compiles his studies, hypotheses, and
proverbs regarding wisdom.
