## RABBI CHAPMAN'S CHRONICLES

### THE MINYAN PROJECT – CONTINUED



I'll start with the headline: As of March 15, 2026, we will return to only reciting Mourner's Kaddish if a *minyan* – 10 Jews over B'nai Mitzvah age – is present in person.

You might ask, "Why are we making this change? And why now?" In this "extra special" (ok, extra-long) edition of *Rabbi Chapman's Chronicles*, I will lay out why we have made this decision and, more importantly, why this should inspire us to redouble our commitment to daily *minyan* at CBS.

First, some history: Six years ago this month, the world stopped in its tracks as the COVID-19 pandemic began. Jewish communities, including CBS, made countless adaptations to keep our members safe in those early days. Among those changes was our decision to – for the first time – loosen the definition of a *minyan*. Since the Talmudic era, a *minyan* was defined as 10 or

more adult Jews present and participating in the prayer service. (Yes, for most of Jewish history, a *minyan* meant 10 men, but CBS has counted *all* adult Jews for decades.) Given the risks of COVID, the Conservative movement's halakhic authority, the CJLS (Committee on Jewish Law and Standards) passed a responsum in July 2021 allowing for a "virtual *minyan*" – 10 adults who can see and hear each other in real-time (i.e., on Zoom) but who are not physically together. The halakhic rationale for this decision was based on the pandemic being a *שעת הדחק* (*shat hadachak* – a time of distress), when we can rely on certain leniencies to prevent further distress.

With this responsum, CBS's prayer leaders could conduct the entire prayer service without a *minyan* present in person, including certain sections that historically were never recited with less than 10 Jews present – Bar'chu, Hatzi Kaddish/Kaddish Shalem, Kedushah, Torah reading from a scroll, and most significantly, Mourner's Kaddish.

Over time, as the risks of COVID abated, CBS's daily *minyanim* returned to some normalcy. At some point, as more could gather safely, the Zoom option was replaced with live stream.

This prestigious designation, given out every three years, recognizes sisterhoods across the country who fulfill specific requirements and demonstrate the values of Women's League. For as long as any of us can remember, we have been humbled to receive this award.

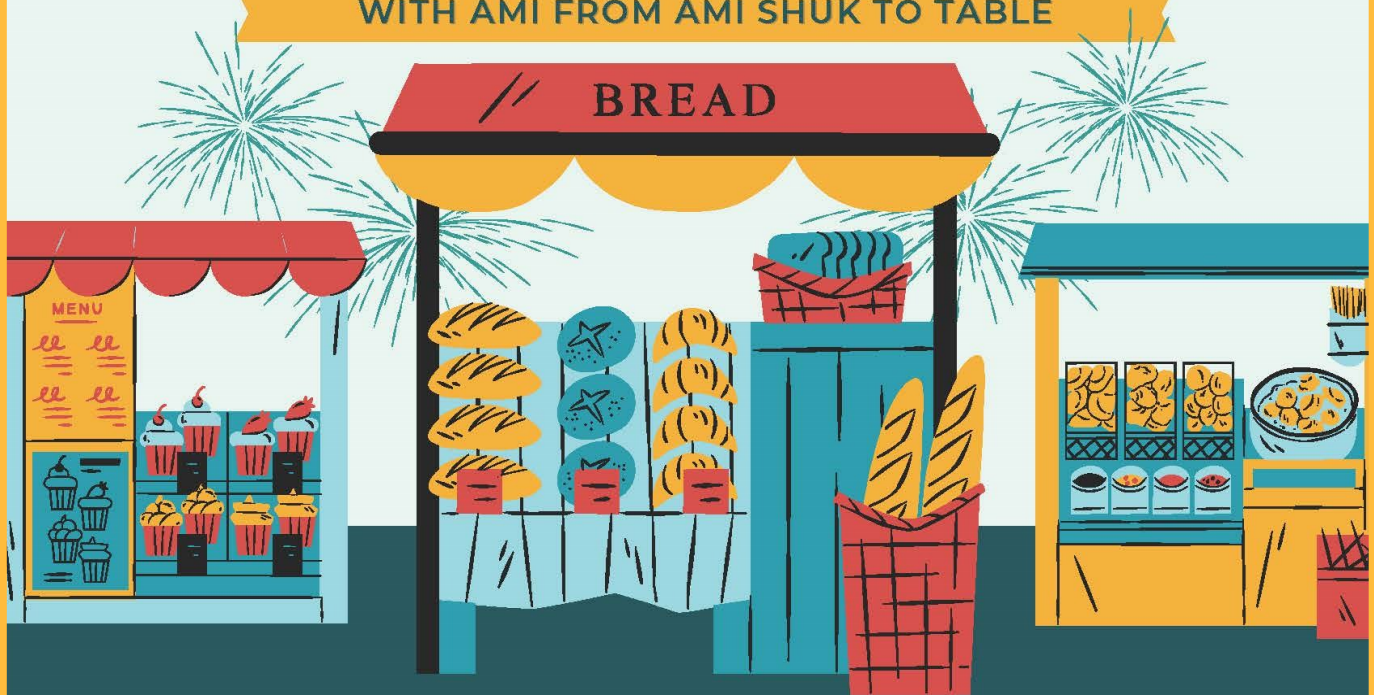

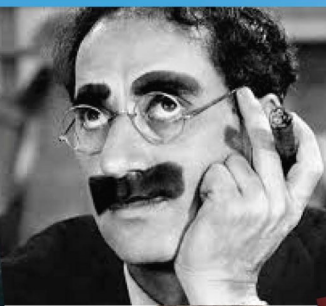

Now folks at home could see and hear those of us in the synagogue, but not the other way around. This arrangement no longer satisfied the requirements of a virtual *minyan* per the CJLS teshuva. As such, today, if no *minyan* is present, prayer leaders will omit all parts of the service that require a *minyan* (Bar'chu, Torah reading, etc.) except Mourner's Kaddish. The exception was made for sensitivity to those reciting Mourner's Kaddish, such as those in a period of mourning or observing a *yahrzeit*.

However, Mourner's Kaddish is designed specifically as a communal prayer. Reciting Kaddish with a *minyan* reminds us that we do not grieve alone – one of Judaism's most powerful lessons. And for generations, "communal" has meant 10 adults.

This brings us to today. While I recognize that COVID and other health concerns persist, it is no longer accurate to say that 10 or more of us cannot safely gather two times per day. **Therefore, as of March 15, 2026, we will no longer recite Mourner's Kaddish unless a *minyan* is present in person.**

For some of you, this simple fact might inspire you to attend *minyan* more often. But I know there are other barriers. If you are still reading (thank you!), I will take this opportunity to make a broader case for our daily *minyan*.

Last May, we shared a survey seeking data about how our members relate to our daily *minyan*. We learned that, while most of our members *know* about our daily *minyan*, relatively few feel a need to participate, unless they are saying Kaddish. In fact, Kaddish kept popping up as a primary rationale for why we offer *minyan* in the first place. Let's be clear, reciting Kaddish during a period of mourning or on a *yahrzeit* is a time-honored Jewish custom, it is not the *reason* our daily *minyan* exists. *Minyan* exists for many reasons not least of which is that we are expected to engage in daily prayer as Jews. Kaddish is important, but it's not the whole story.

The survey responses revealed other misconceptions about our daily *minyan*. Let's take a moment to clear those up.

- **How long is *minyan*?** Morning *minyan* on Torah reading days (Mondays, Thursdays, minor holidays) is about 50 minutes. Morning *minyan* on other days is about 35 minutes. Evening *minyan* is about 25 minutes. *Minyan* always starts on time, but if you are running late, you are still welcome to join us. *Minyan* meets at 7:45am on Mondays through Fridays, 8:45am on Sundays and some federal holidays, and 7:45pm on Sundays through Thursdays.
- **Do I have to dress up or prepare anything?** No! Come as you are. Some come in sweats on their way to the gym, some come in suits on their way to the office. There is nothing to prepare. Kids are welcome, too.
- **What if I don't know anything about Jewish prayer?** You're not alone! Many Jewish adults are unfamiliar with the daily service. Our service leaders always announce pages and instructions. If you want to learn more, simply ask! We frequently offer classes on Jewish prayer through CBS U. Our clergy are always available to meet 1:1 to learn the prayer service together. If you want to dig deeper, we can recommend resources. The best way to learn is simply to practice.
- **What do I "do" during *minyan*? What should I not do?** It's up to you. Many follow along with the prayer leader. But you are also free to let your mind settle on a particular word, phrase, melody, or feeling. Out of respect to others, we ask that you refrain from chatting or other distracting activities once the service starts. Phones should be on vibrate to facilitate a focused environment. (If you need to use your phone, feel free to step outside the prayer space.) On a Torah reading morning, you might be asked to take an Aliyah or another role in the service. Feel free to accept, decline, or ask for instruction if needed. No need to be shy about asking— we all had to learn sometime. At the end of the service, the leader will invite those saying Kaddish to share a word of memory about their loved one, if they choose to.
- **What happens if there is not a *minyan*?** If less than 10 adults are present, we will skip certain sections of the prayer service, including Mourner's Kaddish. We will still read the names listed for *yahrzeit* and offer an opportunity for reflections and private prayer. And no, despite what you may have heard, a Torah scroll cannot count as the 10<sup>th</sup> person if we only have nine present.
- **So, if I am not saying Kaddish, why should I come to *minyan*?** The million-shekel question. There are many valid answers. Here are a few. We may come to *minyan* to share **community** with fellow Jews. We may come to open or close our day with **gratitude**. We may come because we want to ensure a *minyan* for others saying **Kaddish** (as we might someday need ourselves). We may come because our **tradition** has instituted daily prayer as a core component of an engaged Jewish life. We may come to **learn** the week's Torah portion, to brush up on our Hebrew, or to better understand our prayers. We may come to see old **friends** or meet new people. We may come to **pray for healing** for ourselves or others. We may come because we are **proud** that our community is robust enough to offer daily *minyan*. If none of these reasons speak to you, I invite you to come anyway and find your own "**why**" (and then share it with me!).

Praying with a *minyan* has been part of Jewish life for hundreds of years. The word *minyan* comes from *maneh* – to count – and refers to several Biblical allusions that consider 10 adults substantial enough to stand in for the whole community. And starting this month, reciting Kaddish will again be reserved for days when 10 or more of us gather. However, any time Jews gather to pray, whether we hit that magic number or not, it is a *kiddush hashem* – a sanctification of God's name. Twice a day, every day, our community creates space for holiness, prayer, reflection, and connection. *Minyan* is one of the most important things we do as a synagogue. We hope to see you there soon.

**Daily minyan at Congregation Beth Shalom is open to the community.**
