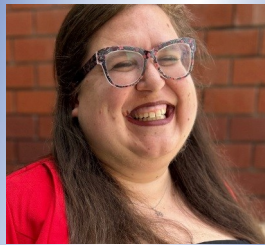

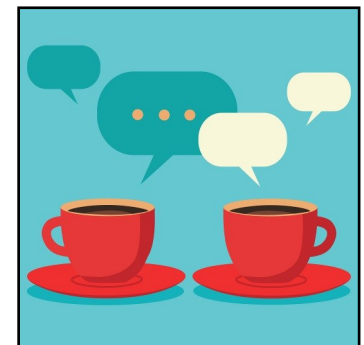


Getting to mark the milestone of my installation with this holy community last month was a highlight of my time here. I felt so lucky to be surrounded by friends, colleagues, and community and am grateful for everyone who helped make the weekend as celebratory as it was. While having people from across my pre-CBS life here was such a treat, part of what made the celebration special was how many people from this CBS community I feel like I know so well already. It does not feel like its been less than a year since I've been here. I've gotten to know so many of you through Shabbat, morning minyan, classes I've taught, afternoons in the lobby before religious school, and numerous other pathways.

In year one of my rabbinate here, I knew that I wanted to prioritize building relationships and getting to know the individuals who make this community what it is. To focus on that, I set a goal of 100 coffee dates in my first year. Hours and hours

spent one-on-one with people getting to hear their CBS stories, us learning about each other, and just getting to know people in a less formal atmosphere. I've gotten to hear incredible stories from the opening days of CBS, meet people who have joined in the last few years, and hear countless stories about why people are here and what they love about this place.

As part of my initiative to get to know people, I want to try something new, inspired by a rabbinic mentor of mine, Rabbi Adam Kligfeld. # CANTOR'S NOTES

I have the pleasure of teaching several adult education classes every year. This month I will be teaching a class for the Continuing Legal Education course at Beth Shalom. One of my topics is *Tzedakah – An Ethical Imperative*.

During this month of Nisan, which leads into Iyar, we find three significant Jewish observances; Passover, which includes the beginning of counting the Omer; then Yom HaShoah; followed by the blended days of Yom HaZikaron and Yom Ha'Atzmaut. Following that period, two dozen CBS members will be traveling to Prague and Poland to explore some significant Jewish history. What a month!

As we study the history of Passover liberation, it offers us valuable memories and lessons which should be applied to our current responsibilities, those of standing up against tyranny, bigotry, and oppression. Similarly, remembering the Shoah is not simply nostalgia; it is a necessary call to recognize the past so that we can try to help resolve present antisemitism.

Just as I believe that ***tzedakah*** is a ***moral imperative***, I feel that ***memory*** is a ***moral imperative*** when it comes to remembering these many days in this month. The memories from slavery to prejudice to freedom are not just historic trivia but an alarm to be cognizant of questions such as 'where is the bread of affliction' today?

How many Jews were alive at the time of the Exodus? The Torah tells us, based on a census, that there were 600,000+ men of fighting age (20). Adding the multitude of others, possibly two million Hebrews were present. How many Jews were alive at the time of the Holocaust? The estimation was 9.5 million Jews in Europe, representing 60% of total Jewish lives across the world. At the time of Israeli Independence, May 14, 1948, there were approximately 600,000 to 700,000 Jews living in the region, meaning only about 6% of the world's 11.5 million Jews were living in Israel.

Today we are desperately in need of building up the Jewish population while we struggle to preserve the lives of 15.5 million Jews, (not counting the many who do not identify as Jews). Antisemitism, which has revealed its odium for the Jews, is real and threatening. Finding ourselves concerned about the future of our universal Jewish families, guarding the history of our People and passing on memories is a sacred task.

Instill within your families this moral imperative of memory, not only to keep the vibrant story of our own personal families alive but that of our People.

*Kol Yisrael Arevim Zeh BaZeh* - the totality of the PEOPLE Israel shall continue to live, only if we each remember to do our part.

## Don't Forget Your Timbrel: What Miriam Can Teach Us About Leadership

*"Miriam, the prophetess, Aaron's sister, took a timbrel in her hand, and all the women came out after her with timbrels and with dances." (Shmot, Chapter 15, Verse 20)*

*"And the women dancing with their timbrels  
Followed Miriam as she sang her song  
Sing a song to the One whom we've exalted  
Miriam and the women danced and danced the whole night long"  
-Debbie Friedman, Miriam's Song*

The scene of Miriam, timbrel in hand, dancing on the shores of the Red Sea with other Israelite women, is an image etched into our collective memory. Whether we know it from the Torah text, the Haggadah, the *Prince of Egypt* film, or the iconic melodies of Debbie Friedman, this moment stands as a pivotal point in our shared history. For many of us, it is also a unique and powerful depiction of female leadership in the Torah. Miriam did more than just lead a song; she facilitated a communal release, allowing the Israelites to express themselves physically and emotionally after their harrowing escape. However, a fascinating detail often goes unnoticed. Rashi, the 11th-century French commentator, asks a deceptively simple question, *"From where did they have timbrels and flutes in the wilderness?"*

Fair point, Rashi! We are taught that the Israelites fled Egypt so quickly, they didn't have time to allow their bread to rise! If they didn't have time to pack basic necessities, how did Miriam and the other women have the forethought to pack musical instruments? Basing his comments on an earlier Midrash, Rashi emphasizes that the women didn't just find these instruments, but they made a conscious, defiant choice to carry them out of Egypt.

Rashi suggests the women had divinely inspired intention with this choice, as well as a heavy dose of optimism. He writes, *"The righteous ones of that generation were confident that the Holy One, Blessed be He, would perform miracles for them, and they prepared for themselves timbrels and flutes."*

These women were confident that they would not only survive the exodus, but that they would have reasons to celebrate. They put their full faith in God to perform miracles for their community so much so that they were willing to carry the literal and physical burden of musical instruments with them. So, when the previously parted Red Sea swallowed up the Egyptian Army, and it was clear that the Israelites were free, Miriam knew exactly what to do. She had anticipated the miracle and prepared for the joy while they were still in the depths of a crisis.

For CBS Sisterhood, this serves as a powerful reminder that building community requires radical optimism. Even if we fall short of our goals in any one year, or the path ahead seems uncertain, we must remember that our future is bright. The women of the Exodus carried timbrels, drums, and other instruments into the desert because they were certain that God would give them a reason to dance. They taught us that a vibrant community doesn't just wait for joy to happen—it packs the instruments in advance!

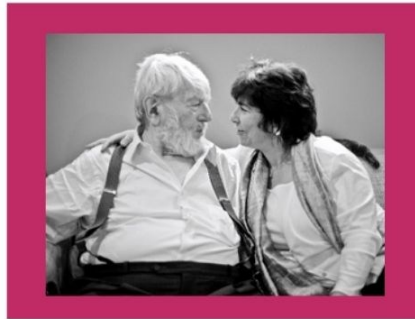

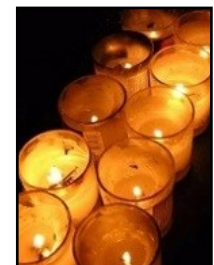
