This Week's Parashah

God commands Moses to take a census of
the Israelites. God tells Moses to make arti-
cles for the Priests to use when entering the
Tent of Meeting. Moses is told to remind the
Israelites to keep the Sabbath as a sign of
the covenant. God gives Moses two tablets
on which the laws are inscribed, but the Is-
raelites have grown impatient in the time that
Moses was up on Mount Sinai. They demand
that Aaron fashion for them a god. Under
great duress, he relents and makes a Golden
Calf. God tells Moses that the Israelites have
turned away from the laws. God will destroy
them and make Moses' descendants a great
nation. Moses pleads with God to spare the
people. As the Israelites worship the calf,
Moses descends the mountain. Angered, he
smashes the tablets and destroys the calf.
God tells Moses to carve two new tablets of
stone for God to inscribe again with the
words of the law. The maftir reading for
Shabbat Parah deals with the red heifer
whose ashes were combined with water to
ritually purify anyone who had been in con-
tact with a dead body.

Because only people who were pure could
eat from the Passover sacrifice, a public
announcement right before Nisan remind-
ed anyone who had become impure to
purify themselves before making the Pass-
over pilgrimage to Jerusalem

Today's Haftarah

Whereas the maftir Torah portion pre-
sents an ancient rite of detoxification
whereby individuals who have become
impure through contact with the dead
are purified and restored to the com-
munity, the corresponding haftarah an-
nounces Israel's revivification (getting
a new heart & spirit) as well as its puri-
fication by God. Rashi understood this
haftarah to be a signal to the commu-
nity that the Pesach sacrifice should be
performed in ritual purity. Likewise, to-
day we aim to be ritually meticulous in
our Pesach preparations.
