This Week's Parashah

Pinchas is the son of the priest Elazar. His zeal in slaying the Israelite man and the Midianite woman (see previous portion), wins him the reward of priesthood for himself and his descendants for all time. Moses and Elazar take a census of all male Israelites over twenty years of age. As God had decreed, all adults who had been a part of the first census, except for Joshua and Caleb, died in the desert on the journey toward the Promised Land. Five daughters of Zelophehad protest the injustice that land was not given to their family solely because their father had no sons. God advises Moses that the plea of the daughters is just. God tells Moses to ascend the mountains to see the land given to the Israelites. Although he may see the land, he will never enter it. Moses is told to ordain Joshua the son of Nun as his successor. The portion concludes with instructions for the daily, Sabbath, monthly, and festival sacrifices to be brought before God.

Today's Haftarah

The Haftarah begins by introducing Jeremiah, a young prophet chosen by God before he was even born. God calls Jeremiah to deliver His messages to the people of Judah and the nations. Although Jeremiah feels unqualified because of his youth, God reassures him that He will guide and protect him. God touches Jeremiah's mouth, symbolizing that His words will be placed there. Jeremiah is given visions, including an almond branch, which signifies that God is watching to fulfill His word. He also sees a boiling pot from the north, representing the danger and judgment that will come upon Judah. God explains that the people have turned away from Him and worshiped false gods. Jeremiah is commanded to speak boldly despite the resistance he will face. God promises to make Jeremiah strong like a fortified city against his opponents. The reading concludes with God recalling Israel's early devotion in the wilderness and describing the nation as His treasured first fruits, emphasizing the special relationship that once existed between God and His people.
